## Holy Love Poems



## Dear Friends,

I was moving books from my bookcase at home to my office. One fell out of the stack. It was an anthology of love poems. Some of the most famous poets of the past few hundred years were represented. I read a few while trying to make sense of the many stacks of books.

The love poems made me remember a book from the Bible that is about beauty and sensuality as a pathway and metaphor toward God's love.

The Biblical book is called Song of Solomon or Song of Songs. Like many readers of the Bible I didn't know that tucked between the book of

Psalms and the book of Isaiah is this little book of only 127 verses long that is one of the most sensual expressions of human sexuality and beauty I have ever read.

At its most basic level, Song of Songs is a celebration of human love. It is a dialogue between a pair of lovers, a man and a woman. It doesn't have a plot or narrative.

The scenes are connected instead by similar motifs and themes of passion, descriptions of physical beauty, memories of past encounters, and longing for the lover's to be with one another.

We enter a world where holiness is expressed through "taste," "touch," "sounds," "sight," and "smells." Holiness is a full sensory experience of sexual and sensual delight. For many learning about faith is a mind thing, but in this reading, knowing God is a full body, full sensory experience.

The lovers call each other "my beloved," "my darling," "my beautiful one," "my dove." Expressions we don't hear often in our culture, or even our own relationships, so they sound awkward for us. We might even get a little embarrassed. Who knows maybe Jay Z or Lil Wayne might read this and try these lyrics out!

Songs rhapsodize the feeling of love that springtime brings. The gifts of spring rain. The sight of new born animals, the aroma of a flowering garden, the sounds of birds singing, are enough to arouse love in the most cynical of persons. With love, sexual excitement, and the fullness of springtime comes belief in new adventures, new possibilities, and most of all, a new outlook on life.

Human relationships, like divine relationships must be cultivated, nurtured, safeguarded, and cherished. Special moments do not just happen; they are cultivated. Intimacy with God and each other cost something. It cost us time and energy.

Intimacy requires our very lives. Not just a part of it, but all of it! A willingness to be present, to remain, to hang in there, be accountable, to see things through, to stop running and come out from hiding are necessary to nurture relationships.

Human love and God's love cannot be taken for granted.

As we must find time to be with the ones we love, so to we must find the time to be with God. Like lovers in search of the perfect time and place to mate, care should be given to creating an atmosphere in which conversation, and intimacy can thrive.

Other than me, I have heard Songs preached once in a church. I am not sure what that means? Hearing these words and allowing the images to wash over us is timely today.

It is timely because sex is everywhere. Much of sex in popular culture is sex of the glands and not the heart, a sex of the moment, and not as gratitude and joy. Song of Songs brings a refreshing sensuality and deep longing. A longing that life is not complete without you. The 'you' in this story is God!

It is important for us to know that tucked into these 127 verses is a language that expands our knowledge toward the journey to God's love. A journey that is loving, sensual and intimate. The journey does not consist in finding a path, as much as in being found on the path. "I once was lost, but now am found."

The intimacy, love and romance that we know to be true in our personal relationships, Songs uses to teach God's love. God is intimate, loving, calls to us, needs us as we need God. The church universal may not have the best track record when it comes to loving and meaningful dialogue on human sexuality. For all those hurt by cruelty of the church in this area. I am truly sorry.

Song of Songs is a reminder that our love romantic and sensual love are pathways to knowing God in a deeper more meaningful way.

We will continue to collect "protein" for the kids. So, let's fill the care packages with peanut butter, nuts, dried beans, jerky, protein bars, etc. and also children's chewable vitamins. They also enjoy children's movies.

For troops, they always enjoy movie DVDs, any kind of snacks, and toiletries (tooth paste, floss, deodorants, foot powder, hair gel, skin lotions, bath gel, shampoo, women's products).

Bins are provided for your convenience in the narthex, or you can drop your donations to the church office during office hours. **Need help with ideas?** No problem! We have a tree in the narthex, with suggestions of things to purchase. Simply take a "tag" off the tree and buy/donate the item on the tag. Easy!



One more way to help is in cash donations to help off-set the shipping costs. The post office provides boxes free of charge, but we pay the postage. The good news is the postage is the same no matter the weight. Bad news is each box costs \$20. Last month we sent 5 boxes, and we expect to send more on the next shipment! PTL!! So, if you choose to give toward postage, please designate it to "missions" on your check memo and drop in the offering plate. If giving cash, use a pew envelope and write "missions" on the front.

PACKING PARTY!!! Please set aside the last Wednesday of every month at 6:00 pm to help at the Packing Parties. For those of you who are table hosts for Hangout, we hope you will stick around and help pack after dinner is served. Last month we packed up 8-10 boxes. Each item in each box is weighed and accounted for, so we do need your help! *"Many hands make light work!"*

Table Leader: A table leader will need to arrive by 5:15 and will be done at 6:00. You will eat dinner with the kids and engage in conversation to get to know them better while keeping them seated.
This position will last for 1 month at a time. Each table needs 2 table leaders.

**Cooks:** We will need 2 cooks per week. We will need you to arrive in time to have dinner on the table by 5:40. The cooks will choose, shop, prepare and serve dinner to the kids. Think simple... kids love corn dogs, pasta, wraps, grilled cheese with a side of fruit. Keep your receipts to turn in.

**Kitchen Helper:** This person would help serve dinner and help clean up the tables and sweep around tables after dinner. We would need you from 5:30-6:15

**Registration:** This position would be from 5:15 - 5:40. You would help parents fill out the correct paperwork and make sure the kids are signed in.

**Lesson Leader:** The lesson leader would read a bible story/ lesson to the kids and lead an activity. This position is very similar to teaching Sunday school. We would need you here 5:50-6:30. This position will last for a month at a time.

**Preschool:** We need 2 volunteers for this position. You will be babysitting 3-5 year olds in the Nursery. We will need you here from 5:50-7:00.

# Adult Bible Studies... Are you "plugged in"???

*Early Morning Men's Bible Study:* A great morning snack and coffee greets this small group of "early-bird" men for their interactive lay lead Bible study. They strive to confirm their faith and look for a deeper meaning through a study of the bible and/or study guides. A deep level of understanding scripture is not required.



We start back up weekly on Tuesday, September 26<sup>th</sup> at 7 am in the church library with a study of the parables.

All men are welcome who would enjoy great conversation and a short bible study. Come and see how the Bible can give us guidance for our lives today. This is a drop-in Bible Study, come when you are able.

*Serendipity Women's Bible Study*: Using the Serendipity Bible for Groups, we alternate between Old and New Testaments, studying a complete book at a time (which is mutually agreed upon by the group), reading a specified portion each week. The study consists of answering the "cup" (ice breaker), "book" (about the text) and "heart" (life application) questions written in the margins of the Bible. Since the questions are found within the pages we're reading, we are literally 'all on the same page'. The passages are read together during our gathering, so there is no homework. We rotate the "facilitator" each week, and spend time sharing prayer requests, praises, and a light snack.

We meet at 8:30 am on Tuesday mornings in the library for an hour and we are open to anyone who may be interested in studying and fellowshipping with other women at FPCU.

*SIPs resume September 5th:* SIPs will still meet Tuesday evenings at 5:00 and we'll be doing using the Serendipity Bible (*see Serendipity Women's Bible Study for description*). We'll be starting September 5th and choosing a book of the Bible for our study. As always, everyone is welcome.

The *P.W. Bible Study* will be meeting alternating Wednesdays (2nd and 4th) in the James Room, 1:30 p.m. This is a really cool way to be in God's Word. Again, nothing to purchase, nothing to 'study' ahead of time; just come and we'll read right from the Word. The Book of John is really filled with blessings for all. The personal sharing between those who participate is extremely special. We welcome new faces anytime. Come and be blessed!

## Anna Maria Mendietta returns to Ukiah!!!

Yes, this year, our 10<sup>th</sup> Christmas Carol-Sing, will again feature this beautiful harpist as our special guest. MEETING Notes from the Session, August 17<sup>th</sup> meeting: MINUTES

**Pastor Report:** Pastoral visitation and communion to several members. Youth Retreat 8-16-17 to 8-18-17 was excellent. Continuing the weekly column, The Journey, in the Ukiah Daily Journal. Study leave 8-1-17 to 8-3-17 was very helpful in getting me prepared for the remainder of 2017.

#### **Council/Committee Reports:**

#### Family Council:

• <u>Worship Committee</u>: Rev. Peter Thompson (former Associate Pastor) will be the Pulpit Supply for 9-24-17. The Session was informed that at this point in time Pulpit Supply is over budget.

Youth & Children's Ministries: MaryAnn and Dory presented the first drafts of the job descriptions for the Nursery Manager (paid position) and Nursery Assistant position (high school age youth could apply). Included on both forms were the responsibilities, qualifications, and actions/behaviors leading to termination. Additionally Dory and MaryAnn talked about Hangout, presenting a paper listing the volunteer positions to be filled, some requiring a month commitment (table leader, lesson leader) and some one time minimum (cook, kitchen helper, registration), and indicating that the plan is to meet weekly on Wednesdays, 5:30 PM-7:00 PM beginning 9-27-17. The job descriptions will be presented to the Personnel Committee for review and recommendation to the Session for approval. Also they mentioned that SWAG would be meeting Sunday evenings beginning 9-3-17. MaryAnn shared with the Session her concerns regarding the vetting process used by the church to screen volunteers, indicating that it appeared to be less effective than it could be. She stated that a fingerprinting program called Life Scan may be a program the church consider participating in, due to the fact that as a nonprofit there is no cost to the church or the volunteer.

Discussed the rationale for collecting donations from parents to help off set the costs associated with Hangout. Motion passed to allow Hangout to collect donations for the 2017-2018 year.

• <u>Missions</u>: Motion passed: NOR CAL CHRISTIAN MINISTRIES use of FPCU facilities. Chili Cook Off is 9-8-17, with the theme being the Wizard of Oz. The Pumpkinfest is 10-21-17 to 10-22-17.

#### **Resource Council:**

- <u>Finance</u>: Distributed/discussed year-to-date finance reports a difference of (\$14,755). Also discussed projections through December. The financial health of the church from September-December may improve due to reduced Associate Pastor costs. Additionally, campership expenses through Children's Ministries was less than expected (\$2000). The financial audit review for 2016 was completed and submitted.
- <u>Buildings/Grounds</u>: Topics of discussion at August meeting: 1) bids for air conditioning for volunteer office, pastor's office and Bromley; 2) new roof for the educational wing; 3) resurfacing the parking lot and monetary involvement of SPACE.

**Clerk Report:** Letters will be sent to two members who have not been attending or contributing in any way to the life of the church to determine their membership wishes.

**Other:** After discussion the Session, by consensus, agreed to schedule a Session/Congregational Forum following the worship service 9-17-17. Discussion items will focus on: 1) going forward with an Associate Pastor or a Youth and Family Pastor: 2) current financial status.

Next regular meeting is October 19<sup>th</sup>, 6:00pm.
