# Coming Out of the Fire



Dear Friends,

I have been an agonizing time for many. The fires continue to rage and each day reveals more pain, loss and death. The grief and shock continue to ripple throughout our families, communities and across the country and around the world.

Witnessing human suffering at any level shakes us to our core. When we see wide scale suffering and destruction like we are witnessing in Mendocino, Napa and Sonoma, we struggle to find any words that can possibly express the depth of our pain, sorrow and horror. The right words to say, at the right time can be elusive. In the face of profound tragedy,

our own feelings of life's frustrations and disappointments seem to just fall away. The phrase, "don't sweat the small stuff", becomes automatic.

Tragedy and sorrow in another human being opens within us a sharing and care of the human condition. Instead of stepping back we step forward and embrace the needs, feelings and life of another. With fires burning acre upon acre I am reminded of the book of Joel. When destruction is all around us, what is important? What isn't? Where is God in this life? Where is God in your life?

The book of Joel uses images of fire and smoke as a way of reminding us how God can create anew out of the ashes of our lives. This is timely today as we have seen and experienced people sifting through the past, and taking what they could into the future.

What is stunning in the face of tragedy is the frequent ring of gratitude. People are devastated. They have lost everything. However, through the depth of their pain many remain grateful for their lives. Person helping person. Neighbor helping neighbor. We are not spiritual or physical islands. We are connected to one another. We are connected to God.

Doris is a member of our church. She is 103 years young. She has lost most of her sight and hearing. Her home was completely destroyed. I saw her on Sunday and she was smiling and had a twinkle in her eye. All she could talk about was how grateful she is and how she is a witness to the best of humanity in the face of devastation. She is an inspiration to us all. Doris' story like so many show us how the Holy Spirit creates space within us and allows us to experience gratitude, when all around is apparently lost.

The book of Joel lifts up the value of human memory. When we have experienced God's grace in the past, we believe in that grace in the present, and the future.

Remembering God's goodness in the past will be important during the days, weeks, months ahead. We will continue to sift through this tragedy and put our lives and community back together. The suffering, death and long-term restoration will be staggering. Yet, something else will also immerge out of the ashes, death and loss. The healing and saving hands of another by the grace of God. When tragedy hits, the human spirit has an endurable resiliency of turning our darkest hour, into our finest hour. Neighbor helping neighbor, county helping county, state helping state.

I am reminded of a quote by author Joshua Graham which was posted on my friends Facebook page. She is a pastor in Santa Rosa. Over 10 people in her congregation lost their homes. She opened up a shelter at her church and took care of mostly senior citizens who had to evacuate their homes. She posted "I survived because the fire inside me burned brighter than the fire around me."

I pray that within all of us we will continue to burn bright and help one another as we rebuild our communities.

Notes from the Session, September 21<sup>st</sup> meeting:

**Pastor Report:** Pastor Daniel reported that he had been in close contact with Sammie Davies and Saturday, September 30 will be a memorial service for her husband Bill. Deacons will help Sammie with the service and reception.

#### **Council/Committee Reports:**

#### Family Council:

- <u>Worship Committee</u>: Since Shirley Lewis, the Worship elder was not present, Daniel announced that Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year and the Worship Committee has discussed having only one service that Sunday at 5:00 p.m. and no church service in the morning. This service would be an intergenerational service and not a children's service. The service would be held from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. It was decided to table the discussion until the worship elder is present.
- <u>Youth & Children's Ministries</u>: MaryAnn Snyder and Dory Haselswerdt brought their concerns before Session regarding the lack of volunteers to man the positions of weekly Hang Out Meetings. Currently, all of the positions are filled for September 27, 2017, but they lack six table leaders for October. They are considering a once a month meeting and discussion followed. Members of Session encouraging them to start out slowly and then add more meetings as the year progresses, with a strong focus on presenting positive feedback from the current workers and a video or snapshots of the activities and children projected during Worship Service announcements. MaryAnn and Dory stated that there are monthly events planned for SWAG from October through December. Dory and MaryAnn reported that a new, inside play structure, has been ordered for the nursery and it should arrive soon.
- <u>Missions:</u> Michele Young reported that \$146.00 was raised for the Pedal for Protein Program. The Pumpkin Fest will be held October 21 & 22, 2017, and we will need volunteers to participate and man the booth that we will sponsor down town both days. Signatures will be collected for volunteers throughout the month.

The question was asked by Michele if the Nor Cal Christian Homeless Group can continue to meet here in the Fellowship Hall on the usual weekday mornings. The group's use of the hall was passed unanimously.

#### **Resource Council:**

- <u>Finance:</u> The Stewardship/Harvest Dinner will be held Sunday November 12, 2017. The Finance Committee is responsible for the meal. ~ Discussion regarding the Board of Pensions payment overage that was not expected. ~ Randy Huffman reported about the Land Partnership - the property left to FPCU will be liquidated by Mendo Foundation and the money will be placed into an account for the church.
- <u>Buildings/Grounds</u>: Parking Lot we have been in an ongoing conversation with the SPACE board regarding the problems that SPACE has in meeting the Handicapped Specs and compliance of numbers of parking spaces required with their last phase of new construction. ~ Work Day will be Saturday, October 2, 2017, from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Randy Huffman said that he will reach out to Boy Scouts to help with the work days at the church.
- <u>Personnel</u>: A motion was made by Roe Sandlin and seconded by Randy Huffman, that First Presbyterian Church will relinquish the Assistant Pastor position and give the Personnel Committee the directive to find job descriptions for a Youth and Young Families Director. The vote passed unanimously.

A second motion was made that the Session approve the job descriptions offered by Roe Sandlin regarding the Nursery Manager and the Nursery Assistant. After discussion, the Session members felt the age of the Nursery Manager should be changed from 18 years to 21 years old. Roe will make that amendment to the job description. It was moved and seconded and passed unanimously.

**Clerk Report:** Letters will be sent to two members who have not been attending or contributing in any way to the life of the church to determine their membership wishes.

**Other:** After discussion the Session, by consensus, agreed to schedule a Session/Congregational Forum following the worship service 9-17-17. Discussion items will focus on: 1) going forward with an Associate Pastor or a Youth and Family Pastor: 2) current financial status.

Next regular meeting is November 16<sup>th</sup>, 6:00pm.

I've been part of dreaming about, planning, then seeing this conference happen. The three sessions I taught, *The Irreducible Minimum: Love, Jesus' Model of Growth and Service*, and

to be hospitable to strangers, or even to get to know our neighbors. We don't make sacrifices for the gospel to go forward among people who are different than we are. In fact, we don't even make friends with people who don't share our opinions and beliefs! This is leading to a divisive spirit within our country.

What we believe – our ideas – have consequences. Our prayer is that the conference will be the start of a movement of biblical thinking throughout the world where ReachGlobal works. Will you pray with us?

When you get this letter, I'll be leaving for a threeweek trip to Uganda, South Africa and Kenya. In each place, I'll be seeing how the principles of biblical worldview have been translated into effective training programs. Please pray for my learning on this 'best practices' journey.
