







CARE PACKAGES FOR OUR MILITARY AND ORPHANAGE IN DJIBOUTI ~ In anticipation of David's return, our last two Packing Parties for Djibouti will be January 31st and February 28th.

David writes, "What we need most are: beans, peanut butter, and children's vitamins. We could also use toothpaste and toothbrushes for the kids. You are a blessing to the children who are living on the street. You really are saving lives."

So, for the kids, let's fill the care packages with peanut butter, dried beans, and children's chewable vitamins. For troops, they always enjoy movie DVDs, any kind of snacks, and toiletries (tooth paste, floss, deodorants, foot powder, hair gel, skin lotions, bath gel, shampoo, women's products). Bins are provided for your convenience in the narthex, or you can drop your donations to the church office during office hours.

The grant provides for quality protein food such as nut butters, dairy products, legumes, and lean meats to help feed the hungry in our community. The funds resulted from 54 Redwoods Presbytery bicycle riders cycling from 10 to 310 miles and the generous giving by friends and family of the riders from churches within our Presbytery.

MINUTES**

Notes from the Session, November 16th meeting:

PASTOR'S REPORT: I had pastoral visitations to: Joyce Sarber (communion, 10-25-17); Sammie Davies, 11-12-17; Adriane Nicolaisen, 9-27-17 and 10-18-17. I conducted the memorial service at the church for Al Nicolaisen, 11-2-17. Stewardship Sunday (11-12-17) was a success. **Presbytery Retreat:** The retreat was held at Westminster Woods, 11-10-17 to 11-11-17. The retreat emphasized our personal mediation/prayer practices. How our own practices connect to our congregations.

CLERK'S REPORT: Communion was served during the Sunday morning worship service, 11-5-17. Ongoing efforts are continuing to contact active members (locally, out of town) who have not been attending or contributing to the life of the church to determine their desired level of participation.

COUNCIL-COMMITTEE REPORTS

Family Council: Children/Youth: Hangout: Volunteer participation has been improving and is appreciated. Some of the children we work with have behavior issues, and the staff has worked to develop an environment where they feel safe, accepted and accountable. Hangout's last meeting for 2017 will be 11-29-17. The youth are planning to go caroling around the church neighborhood 12-10-17, and invite the church family to join them. **Congregational Life:** The Harvest Dinner (11-12-17) following the Sunday Stewardship Service was successful. Thanks to all Session members who helped. **Adult**

Ministries: A New Members Class is being scheduled for Sunday 1-28-18, following the worship service. The class will meet for 3-4 hours, with lunch provided.

Resource Council: Finance: Copies were provided the Session of: 1) 2017 Actual Income/Expenses; 2) Income/Expense as of 10-31-17. It was noted that the difference between income/expenses had lessened (-7,062). The Session reviewed, discussed, and adjusted the first draft of the 2018 budget. **Buildings and Grounds:** Estimates received for repairing the parking lot range from \$14,000 to \$64,000, depending on the work to be done (ongoing discussion with S.P.A.C.E.). Continuing to research air-conditioning needs and costs (\$10,000?) and roofing. Financing the needed improvements will need to consider developing a capital campaign. **Personnel: Nursery Staffing:** Dory and MaryAnn have graciously agreed to job share the Nursery Manager position. The job description for the Director of Youth/Ministries is being developed. (By consensus Session agreed that the job description could include presenting the Sunday message once-a-month.)

NEW BUSINESS

The Session selected the following Ruling Elders to present to the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting, 1-21-18, to serve as the corporate officers for 2018:

President, Kevin DeVries; **Secretary,** Shirley Lewis; **Treasurer,** Randy Beckler.

 - Purchase Battery Candles for Christmas Service: 250 for approximately \$325.00.
 - Communion time change from January 7, 2018 to January 14, 2018.
 - Christmas Singalong as a fundraiser for NorCal Christian Ministries.
- **Mission Committee:**
 - Taking a “LOVE” offering on December 3, 2017, for the Mission trip of the Mack family to Africa in January, 2018.
 - Use of FPCU facilities by NCCM.
 - Waiving the facility use fee for NorCal Christian Ministries for November and December. Normal Fees resume in January 2018 should they need to continue at FPCU.
- **New Business:**
 - Schedule the Annual Congregational Meeting for 12-3-17.
 - Session instruct/examine new elders and deacons, 12-17-17 (alternate date 1-14-18).
 - Ordination and Installation of elders and deacons, 12-17-17 (alternate date 1-14-18)
 - Schedule the Annual Congregational Meeting for 1-21-18


