

"Each one should give what he has decided in his heart he should give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." ~ **II Corinthians 9:7**

The Bible tells us how God wants us to offer our money to Him. Whatever we give to the Lord is to be given cheerfully. In II Corinthians 9:7, the English word, cheerful, comes from the Greek word *hilarion*. This is also where we get our English word, hilarious. This coming month we will continue to hold Youth Group weekly, as well as the Nursery, Sunday School, and Donuts & Devotionals (a Bible study for grades 6-12) on Sunday mornings. In addition, we have the opportunity to take another trip to Blackbird on November 10th for their annual Winterfest! The Ukiah Stole of Many Colors

Internationally to locally, 1st Presbyterian Church of Ukiah has an impact. Our recent gift to Pastor Daniel of the stole is a spiritual gift tangible and intangible. As people recall, it took a few months to get to know Pastor David, and similarly it took a few months to get to know Pastor Daniel. Pastor David, in a recent sermon, elaborated on spiritual equipment; for Pastor Daniel that stole equipped him in his new ministry at 1st Presbyterian Church, Oakland. The stole acted as plumage – eliciting lots of questions drawing the congregation closer to him and him to his congregation. "Friends, may it be so for each of you and also very much so for me."

It is a Navy tradition to pipe someone aboard ship – typically used for more senior officers.

On November 4th, we get to pipe Rear Admiral Endel Lee aboard the pulpit of the USS FPCU. Our featured guest this year are "4Euphs4Him", a euphonium quartet, directed by Marshall Merklin. Also joining us this year are Jim Howlett, Les Boek, and Gayle Harris.

Rehearsals for the choir have also begun – it's not too late to join in. At this point, it might be challenging if you don't read music, but it you learn quickly by ear, please do come sing with us.
