Song Story... I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow

A Harvard professor of literature and one of America' greatest writers, Henry Wadsworth, while publishing his books, dark clouds were gathering over his life and over all America. In 1861, his wife tragically died when her dress caught fire in their Massachusetts home. That same year, the Civil War broke out, tearing the nation apart. Two years later, during the fiercest days of the conflict, Henry's son, Charley (age 17), ran away from home and hopped aboard a train to join President Lincoln's army. Charley contracted typhoid fever and malaria, and after recovery, returned to war to be shot. The bullet nicked his spine and came close to paralyzing him. Henry brought him home, and for weeks, sat by his son's side slowly nursing Charley back to health.

On Christmas Day, 1863, Henry gave vent to his feelings in this plaintive carol that can only be understood against the backdrop of war. Two stanzas, now omitted from most hymnals, speak of the cannons thundering in the South and of hatred tearing apart 'the hearth-stones of a continent'. The poet feels like dropping his head in despair, but then hears the Christmas bells. Their triumphant pealing reminds him that "God is not dead, nor doth He sleep".
