The cities of Ukiah, Willits, Fort Bragg, Boonville, Cloverdale and Lakeport make up the Yokayo-Logger District of the Redwood Empire Council. District Chairman Randy Huffman announced important recognition awards for two members of our congregation.





Perrine Kirchen was awarded the District Award of Merit. This is the highest award that can be given at the Boy Scout District level. Perrine was recognized for her service as an adult leader with Ukiah Troop 75 and for her outstanding efforts and success leading the Popcorn Sales Fund-raiser for the district. Randy Beckler received the Spark Plug Award. This award is presented to adult leaders who are recognized for their on-going high-quality efforts for the advancement of Scout ideals and objectives. The New Year brings a new Elder to the Missions Committee ~ Mark Smith. Thank you, Michelle, for your leadership over the past three years. I am happy to be working with this well-established group that includes Michele Young, Wilma Pribyl, Kitty Sandelin, Shelly and Kevin Mack, Jaunita Coddington, and new members Randy Beckler and Kathy Smith. We met on January 27 to discuss our various tasks for the upcoming year that support our numerous ministries. Here is a summary of some of the activities that we discussed...



Don't forget to bring your Cents-Ability offering to church on the first Sunday every month. The collection is taken during communion. Baskets are in the front for your convenience. If you need a collection container to keep at home, you can pick one up in the narthex. Remember all your money is used to help feed the hungry in our area. Thank you for helping with your prayers and donations.

Meals-to-go Fundraiser:

These fundraisers fund local mission projects in our church and community, including Christian Ministries, Jail Ministries and support of the Uganda Orphanage, to name a few. We will continue to have our Meals-to-go fund raisers and a sub-committee will also be discussing changes to the meal package to assure quality and value. Thank you all for supporting this important ministry!

Care Packages and Packing Parties:

The Care Packages support the Caritas orphanage in Djibouti and military personnel. In the past we have raised money from the sale of craft items made by the children of Caritas, as well as jewelry. We have made donations in someone's honor at Christmas time in support of this ministry.

The Packing Parties are a quarterly activity that assemble the food items that we send to support the Caritas Orphanage. We will continue to collect Peanut Butter, Beans and pectin based chewable vitamins (such as SmartyPants available at Costco). We also bake cookies in May and November to include in the packages. We much appreciate your empty Pringle cans to store the cookies.

Uganda Orphanage:

As a result of our contributions the construction of the new orphanage is complete. We will be continuing to support this orphanage. A group of six, including Kevin and Shelly Mack are traveling to the orphanage in early 2020. There are also plans for the shipment and installation of a modular solar electrical generating system next year.

In June, we plan to have a rummage sale to support those activities.

Pedal-for-Protein:

This bicycle fundraiser happens in September each year. Money raised goes to supply food banks within our Presbytery. Our local food bank received a check for \$2,500 for 2017 & 2018!



Operation Christmas Child:

Last year was the twenty fifth year for this ministry. Shoeboxes with various items for children are collected in November of each year. The boxes have been shipped to Bosnia and the Dominican Republic to share the Good News of Jesus Christ to the children and their families.

Shoe Recycling:

There is a bin in the Narthex to collect shoes in good condition. The shoes are sent to a company that ships the shoes to 50 countries around the world. We are paid by the pound for the shoes. Thank you for your contributions.

Other Activities:

We also support NorCal Ministries, Target Truth Ministries, Student Ministries and Interfaith Lunches.

We have decided to 'table' the Pumpkinfest, Chili Cookoff, and Christmas Charity Faire this year to allow more time and energy to focus on our other ministries. As much as we want to 'do it all', we just are not able to!

We have a number of suggestions regarding purpose: carpet replacement in Library; sound abatement in Cafe; carpet replacement in James Room, to name a few.


Can we meet after church Sunday, February 17th? Grab some snacks and coffee and we'll meet in the Library. Jaunita & Wilma, Co-Chairs.

2019 Per Capita Contribution

What is the Per Capita rate for FPCU and are we required to pay?

Per Capita 2019 General Fund: \$26.43

Per Capita 2019 Building Fund: \$5.00

TOTAL \$31.43 per member

Per capita is not mandated, but we are obligated to pay for all members. Therefore, we do ask that you please reimburse the First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah this amount in addition to your regular pledge. Simply write "Per Capita" in the memo section of your check and drop in the offering plate.

What is Per Capita and why do we pay?

Per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Said another way, it is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund — part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Because every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system should be shared by everyone as well. Per capita funding is how we mutually share the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future.

What does Per Capita fund?

For example, some funding provides the costs of bringing together:

- Commissioners and advisory delegates to the General Assembly
- necessary tools to develop and administer ordination exams to seminarians preparing to become future pastors

Per Capita also funds (some examples):

- · work in the area of vocation, helping all Presbyterians discern their sense of God's call in their lives
- information, advice, and counsel to presbyteries and pastors whose members have immigration issues
- the expenses of the Moderator and Vice Moderator of the General Assembly as they travel across the church to attend church anniversaries, presbytery meetings, retreats, ecumenical gatherings, and so forth
- a Presbyterian presence at ecumenical groups and gatherings in this country and worldwide, which extends our mission efforts and our work for peace and justice far beyond what we can do by ourselves and promotes Christianity

Session minutes: December 21, 2018

Pastor's Report: Officiated the wedding of Nik Perry and Gabriella Holl at FPCU; Juanita Coddington, Deacon and I served communion to shut-ins; performed a baptism at the First Presbyterian Church of Hollister.

Director of Youth/Families Report:

- Youth Groups: As many as 11 students have attended on any given night, and a third supervisor will need to be added if the number continues to grow. There will be no meetings between 12-24-18 and 1-7-19. The team is planning new "topics" series for each week and hoping to introduce guest interviews.
- Hangout: 12-19-18: Attendance including parents was about 30. Announced the need for parent volunteers. For the present time Hangout will continue meeting monthly. Hangout will not meet January 2019, but will start meeting again in February 2019.
- Volunteer Meeting: 12-9-18: Great attendance at the meeting. Went over rules, consequences, volunteer expectations, opportunities, etc.
- Youth Group Christmas Party: 12-14-18: The party was held at Roe and Kitty Sandelin's home. 11 students and 5 leaders attended. Everyone enjoyed the food, Calendar games, and white elephant present exchange. Some parents stayed after the party to socialize.
- Upcoming Events and Activities: A short 5 minute kid's Christmas pageant will be part of the Sunday morning worship service, 12-23-18. Plans are underway for a boy's game night and a girl's Galentine's Day Party. Work is beginning on planter boxes for the outside of the church. Initial thought/discussion is underway regarding a 30-hour famine activity.

RESOURCE COUNCIL

• **Finance:** Presented two reports to Session: 1) Income-Expense as of 11-31-18, indicating income was \$224,504 and expenses were \$213,379, leaving a surplus of \$11,125. 2) Full Calendar View of 2018 against 2018 Budget and 2018 Estimate, indicating that with the use of the 2016 surplus (\$15,000) income and expenses for 2018 will balance out \$260,384.

FAMILY / OUTREACH COUNCIL

• Worship and Music: City of Ukiah will not allow flashing/moving signs to be put up (example: Episcopal Church on Orchard St.). FPCU will continue with the banners. A plan has been developed to have a "Healing Service" at the end of the morning worship service, the first Sunday of the month beginning 1-6-19. All currently serving elders and past elders are encouraged to participate.

• **Missions:** The net amount from the Meals-to-Go fundraiser was \$2,300. The committee distributed the money to the following organizations: Nor Cal Christian Ministries, \$500; Target Truth Ministries, \$300; Ukiah Valley Christmas Effort, \$500; FPCU camperships/scholarships, \$1,000.
