Sermon Series May 1-29: The Birth of the Church



Come to the Party

On Sunday May 15 we will celebrate the birthday of the Church-Pentecost. So, let's party!

Pentecost was originally an Old Testament holiday called Shavuot or Festival of Weeks in Exodus 34:22 and Deuteronomy 16:10. The holiday commemorates the giving of the Law on Mt Sinai, 50 days following the first Passover and liberation of the Hebrews from Egypt. All Jews were required to gather in Jerusalem to celebrate this holiday, just as they were required to come to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover each year.

Our Lord Jesus Christ was crucified during the Passover celebration. When He rose from the dead on Easter Sunday, Jews from all over the world were still gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate Pentecost 50 days later. When the day arrived, God poured out the Holy Spirit on all followers of Jesus. And the Church was born.

So, let's celebrate! Let's invite our friends and family to join us in worship! Exciting things always happen on Pentecost, just look at what happened in the second chapter of the New Testament book of Acts.

A Sabbatical Thought

The church has given me twelve weeks during the summer of 2017 to take a sabbatical. I recently received a copy of a newsletter article written by a colleague of mine in the ministry. This article was very well written and I would like to share parts of it with you. I think the author does a wonderful job of explaining why it is important for pastors to take a Sabbatical.

"God blessed the seventh day and make it holy, because on it God rested from all the work of creation" – Genesis 2:3

Why did God rest? Walter Brueggemann would affirm that it was not because God was tired out, burned out, or fresh out of creative ideas. God rested because unlike other gods in our lives that demand incessant production and insatiable consumption, YHWH has a "divine commitment to relationship (covenant) rather than commodity [production]...That divine rest on the seventh day of creation has made clear (a) that YHWH is not a workaholic, (b) that YHWH is not anxious about the full functioning of creation, and (c) that the well-being of creation does not depend on endless work."

Why am I taking sabbatical leave June-August 2016? Because: a) I am (trying) not (to be) a workaholic, (b) I am (learning to) not (be) anxious about the church being any less without me, and (c) the well-being of this wonderful congregation does not depend on my 24/7/365 presence. In that respect, sabbatical leave is an act of trust in my colleagues (ruling elders, teaching elders, and staff). It is also an opportunity for which I am deeply thankful to this congregation; the offer of sabbatical leave is just one of the many ways you show how much you value my ministry with you...

If you have any questions about my sabbatical leave, please don't hesitate to ask. I am looking forward to this time and would love to talk about it and share plans as the time gets closer. I am not sure what we will be doing next summer, but as plans are made you will hear all about it. Thank you for allowing me this time to rest, find a slower pace for life, and be with family.

- > Meals to go Fundraiser for Mission Trip: With all expenses paid our total funds raised are: \$9,161.20!! Donations are still being accepted and appreciated. Our team is now focusing on the logistics of our stay and preparing for the work at hand. - > Chili Cook-Off Get your recipes ready for the upcoming Chili Cook-off on **September 9th**. Our in house Chili Cook-Off will be held on Sunday, **August 28th**.
- > Petal for Protein: On Sunday, September 18th our church will have the pleasure of hosting the Presbytery's bicyclists on their first stop in their five-day ride from Mendocino to Rockville. We will provide a refreshing snack, dinner and overnight accommodations (volunteers?) with a nutritious breakfast to help them with the ride ahead! Last year the coming together of 23 cyclists, friends and congregations throughout the Presbytery of the Redwoods to help struggling grass root food pantries, to provide enough protein based food for hungry people. At the end of the seven day, 429 mile ride, congregations, riders, families and friends raised \$33,643. Grants to eight food banks in our Presbytery totaled \$28,643 with 1,000 going to The Homeless Garden Project in Santa Cruz and \$5,000 donated to Valley Fire Relief in Lake County.

As you can see from the details below, summer camp can be expensive, especially if you are sending siblings. Your support will help send these kids to camp!

Camp Costs:

Westminster Woods' Tiered Rate Program: Recognizing that families have different abilities to pay for camp, Westminster Woods has instituted a voluntary three-tier fee program. It is a 'free will' system; you choose the level that is comfortable and affordable for your family. All campers receive the same amazing experience regardless of the amount paid.

Tier I is our subsidized rate and does not reflect the full cost of operating summer camp programs ~ \$450 for a full week

Tier II is our partially subsidized fee for those who choose to pay a little more to cover camp costs ~ \$500 full week

Tier III more closely reflects the actual cost of camp, including the cost of maintaining our beautiful facility ~ \$550 full week





VBS is August 1-5 from 5:30-7:30 in the evening (dinner provided). The ages are 3-years-old through 5th grade.
