PRAY and then vote on June 7!

One of my most memorable experiences in Iraq was seeing Iraqis vote for the first time in 2005. Each person who voted was threatened with death. And yet, 80 percent of the people still voted. The turn out in 2012 for the US General Election was 55 percent. Seriously!

We have a responsibility as Christians and as Americans to vote. The institution of government was created by God (Romans 13:1). Like all institutions, governments were affected when Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden. (Genesis 3). Now governments struggle with evil, corruption, and sin. This is one of the reasons why God sent His Son to our earth. Governments are being reconciled to God through Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:19). And we have been called to join with Jesus in this reconciling work (2 Corinthians 5:20). One of the ways in which we can do this is to vote.

The California Primary Election is June 7. The US General Election is November 8. If you are not registered to vote, you can do so on line at: <u>http://www.sos.ca.gov/elections/voter-registration/</u>

Pray and then vote. Ask God to guide you as you vote on candidates and issues. We can help our Lord to reconcile our government to God by electing the people that God wants in the government. We can also pass the laws that God wants for our government. But we can only do this if we vote.

A Day in the Life of a Camper

ach morning the kids at Westminster Woods get up bright and early. They get dressed and head down to Vernon Hall where they eat a big breakfast buffet-style. After breakfast they spend some time quietly doing morning devotions, and then they have a large group activity to get them pumped up and ready for the day. This group time lasts until lunch time and usually includes a lesson time and some other fun activity like hiking, swimming, games, or crafts. After lunch is mail call, followed by either FOB (Flat On Bunk) rest time or another large group ac-



tivity depending on the age of the campers. For the rest of the afternoon the kids get free time. The kids get to decide what they want to do at free time, and the options very depending on which camp they are attending. These options include activities such as swimming, hiking, Frisbee golf, basketball, games on the big green field, creek exploration, dirty nine square, craft shack, lanyards, ropes course, cargo net, archery, writing letters, or any other number of fun things. Free time ends with dinner, once again in Vernon Hall. After dinner they have group time again, and then each age group has their own campfire in their section of camp. At campfire they sing songs, act out skits, share what they learned and experienced that day, and listen to a pastor give a campfire talk about the daily Bible verses. By this time it is late and the kids are ready for bed. The next morning they get to wake up and do it all over again! I am so excited to report that we have a record thirteen kids going to camp this summer at Westminster

Woods! That is thirteen young lives that will be touched by this amazing place through the Holy Spirit. What a blessing! We have many families that cannot pay the \$550 dollars it costs to send one child to camp, so we are offering camperships through the church. We are asking the families to pay the remaining half, but we need \$2,350 in camperships this year to get all the kids to camp in July. We have \$1,800 in the budget and we made \$550 at the bake sale. So we are still around \$300 short, but the kids have some other fundraisers they want to do to try and close that gap. Of course, donations from church members are always welcome!

I get the chance to be the campfire speaker the week our kids are there, which will be July 17th-23rd. We will leave Sunday after church. Please feel free to write to the kids and let them know our church is thinking of

them. Getting mail is always fun! Just make sure to put the camp code and the camper's name on the envelope. If you give me your mail at church the morning of the 17th you can save on postage!

On Sunday, September 18th our church will have the pleasure of hosting the Presbytery's bicyclists on their first stop in their five-day ride from Mendocino to Rockville. We will provide a refreshing snack,



dinner and overnight accommodations (volunteers?) with a nutritious breakfast to help them with the ride ahead! Last year the coming together of 23 cyclists, friends and congregations throughout the Presbytery of the Redwoods to help struggling grass root food pantries, to provide enough protein based food for hungry people. At the end of the seven day, 429 mile ride, congregations, riders, families and friends raised \$33,643. Grants to eight food banks in our Presbytery totaled \$28,643 with 1,000 going to The Homeless Garden Project in Santa Cruz and \$5,000 donated to Valley Fire Relief in Lake County.
