



A Hand Up, not a Hand Out 🛛 🕋



ur neighbors in Lake County have always struggled with economic issues. Habitat for Humanity has been part of their community for eighteen years, building 20 homes and fixing countless others over the years.

hen the fires hit in Lake County last year, burning thousands upon thousands of acers, Habitat for Humanity sprang into action. 2,000 homes were lost in the four major fires in 2015, so Habitat has their work cut out for them. They are building up their staff and funding to help the poorest who lost everything.

ight of us from Ukiah got the pleasure of going over there to help Habitat in their efforts to rebuild Lake County. We spent five days over there camping right on Clear Lake.

n Monday and Tuesday we drove out east of the City of Clear Lake along highway 20 to a home that had been burned by the Rocky Fire last July. Walter had lost everything in the fire and has been living on the land in a converted bus for the past year. At this work site they needed to get water to the home site, which was several hundred feet yards below the building area. There was a well on the lower end of the property and the water needed to be pumped up to a water tank and then down to the home site. They had a trench digger for the open part of the hill, but much of the hill was too steep. So our job the first two days was to dig the trench for the pipes, lay the pipes, then fill in the trench. It was back breaking work through rock with picks and shovels, but it was wonderful to see the end result at the end of the second day and know that Walter now has fresh water to the spot that will someday be his home again.

• New of this pering Pines. Most of this area was burned during the Valley Fire last September. Habitat had a piece of property that was donated to them after the family lost everything in the fire and moved on to a different location. The lot needed to be prepared for building, and that included finding all the uncharted water pipes that ran through the property. They need to cap the pipes and reroute them so the neighbors can still have water but the old broken pipes aren't' leaking all over the property they need to build on. We spent the whole day, once again with shovels and picks, finding and uncovering buried pipes.

n Thursday we helped Habitat build a fence around a property that was getting trashed and dumped on by the neighbors. They had used an auger to initially dig post holes through the rocky soil, and then we worked to clean the holes, mix the cement, and set the fence poles in the holes. It took the whole day to do this project, but I guarantee there has never been a straighter and more perfectly set fence.

e were looking forward to putting up the fencing on the poles we set the day before, but Habitat needed us on another project for Friday. Habitat has several storage units in the Clear Lake and Lower Lake areas where they keep supplies and tools. Over the last 18 years these storage units has become a jumbled mess. So we spent the day clearing and organizing one of their storage units. It was a blessing to be able to work inside on the one day that it rained!

here may have been eight of us that went on the trip, but the whole church made it possible. Thank you all for your support through prayer, giving, and helping with the fundraiser. It was a blessing to know that we could leave for the week and all of you were taking good care of the church and its' ministries while we were gone. Thank you.

e are talking about taking a day of two later this summer o in the fall to go over and help again. If you are interested please let me know!

God Bless America

God Bless America, Land that I love. Stand beside her, and guide her Thru the night with a light from above. From the mountains, to the prairies, To the oceans, white with foam God bless America, My home sweet home.

Six Things You May Not Know About "God Bless America"

If you grew up in the United States, chances are you can sing "God Bless America." You might not remember exactly where you learned it, but you probably know most of the words, and you may find yourself singing along with the simple melody. Although it has become a part of our American consciousness, the history of "God Bless America" is more complex than it seems. Here are some things about the song that may surprise you:

1. It was written by the same composer who wrote "White Christmas." Having attained the "composerless" status of an anthem or a folk song, Irving Berlin originally wrote the song in 1918 as the finale to an all-soldier revue called Yip, Yip, Yaphank, but he ultimately decided not to include it, tucking it away in his trunk of discarded songs.

2. When it was first performed by Kate Smith in 1938, it was considered a "peace song." Berlin rediscovered his old song in 1938, looking for a "peace song" as a response to the escalating conflict in Europe. He made changes to it and gave it to radio star Kate Smith to perform on her radio show on the eve of the first official celebration of Armistice Day—a holiday originally conceived to commemorate world peace and honor veterans of the Great War.

3. It was boycotted by the Ku Klux Klan. Since Berlin was a Jewish immigrant (born Israel Baline, the son of a Jewish cantor who fled persecution in Europe), there were some who questioned both his right to evoke God and to call the United States his "home sweet home." In 1940, the song was boycotted by the KKK and the Nazi-affiliated German American Bund.

4. It has a long connection with sporting events. In 1940, it was played at every Brooklyn Dodgers home game, and during halftime at college football games. In 1966, the Chicago White Sox briefly replaced the national anthem with "God Bless America," though Berlin himself urged the team to return to the national anthem. In the 1970s, replacing the anthem with "God Bless America" became a good-luck charm for the Philadelphia Flyers hockey team. And "God Bless America" was added to the seventh inning stretch after the September 11th attacks in 2001.

5. It first appeared in film in This is the Army (1943), starring Ronald Reagan. In 1943, it made its movie debut in This is the Army, starring Ronald Reagan (known for his intertwining of politics and religion, using the song and phrase "God Bless America' at campaign rallies and presidential events). In fact, Reagan first appears on screen while the song is playing.

6. It is a source of revenue for the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. Irving Berlin himself has never made money on the song; in 1940, he created the God Bless America Fund, through which all royalties have been donated to the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts (now focused on the scouts in the greater New York City area). The song will remain under copyright until the year 2034.



I. POSITION SUMMARY:

Under the general supervision of the Office Manager, perform general maintenance, light maintenance, event setup and security of the church building.

II. ACCOUNTABILITY:

Works under the direction of the Office Manager with oversight from the Senior Pastor. Maintains close relationship with the Buildings & Grounds Elder.

III. ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Representative maintenance duties include, but may not be limited to:

- Vacuum, sweep, scrub and/or mop restrooms, kitchen, fellowship hall, and library floors as needed; •
- Clean, scrub and sanitize counters, sinks and fixtures in restrooms and kitchen •
- Fellowship Hall and Café: return furniture to appropriate setup, if needed •
- **Restrooms:** •
 - Restock paper and soap supplies as needed in restrooms; 0
 - 0 Empty trash cans
- Kitchen .
 - Empty dishwasher when needed 0
 - Clean outside of appliances 0
 - Empty trash cans 0
- Sanctuary: tidy the room prior to Sunday •
- Report safety and sanitation hazards as appropriate; •
- Pick up litter from grounds and building (inside and outdoors) •
- Curbside garbage
- Every other week, cleaning will include the Sanctuary, Nursery/Preschool and Sunday School Rooms •

Representative event setup duties include, but may not be limited to:

- Set up tables/chairs as required.
- Subsequent cleaning after event, including but not limited to sweep/mop floors, empty trash. Report major cleaning issues ٠ to Office Manager for subsequent billing to renter.

VI. WORKING CONDITIONS:

- Indoor and outdoor environment;
- Subject to regular exposure to fumes, dust and odors;
- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate various maintenance tools and equipment;
- Climbing ladders
- Heavy physical labor
- Seeing to perform various work assignments;
- Standing, walking, twisting, stooping, crouching, kneeling, bending over at the waist, grasping, reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally, pushing, pulling and moving, lifting and/or carrying 0-50 pounds to waist height.
- Hazards include exposure to cleaning chemicals, and working at heights.

VII. TIME EXPECTATION:

The duties of the Facilities Maintenance Assistant are expected to require up to 26 hours every two weeks. Maintenance duties may require up to 21 hours and Security duties require approximately 5 hours. Security duties are to be performed after 8:00 pm. The working of additional hours must have prior approval of the Office Manager or Senior Pastor and so noted on the timecard. Hours will be paid from the timecard only.

VIII. EVALUATION:

The Senior Pastor, Office Manager, and Chair of the Personnel Committee, will complete a performance evaluation annually. The Personnel Committee shall review the adequacy of compensation annually.
