Notes from the Session Meeting, May 17th

Motions / Decisions:

- Approve to create a new church directory
- Approve a bid of \$15,260 (Valley Paving) to repair / seal the church parking lot
- Approve Warren Pribyl as Commissioner-elect to 5/18 Presbytery meeting

Council – Committee Reports: Family Council:

- Children/Youth: Slight increase in number of volunteers; last Hangout is 5/23. "Thank you dinner" for volunteers/spouses on 5/30.
 <u>SWAG</u>: there is a core of active jr/sr higher. Discussions to determine another meeting night to accommodate the needs of volunteers. <u>Westminster Woods</u>: a smaller contingent of youth attending camp this summer (older youth not interested)
- **Worship / Music**: 5/20 Pentecost, youth will participate in all aspects of the service.
- Missions: Transferring Designated Funds (Hispanic Microloans) to Compassionate Ministries, where they will continue to be available as loans to the Hispanic community. This move was done due to there not being an Hispanic program for a number of years and the committee agreed it made better sense to combine the two "like" programs. Uganda Orphanage: Sale of tri-tip dinners/donations: \$7,500 after expenses. \$7k for phases 1-3, including new rood, with \$500 'seed money' for phase 4.

Resource Council:

- **Finance**: <u>Ramos Property</u>: Meredith Lintott has agreed to legally represent FPCU to resolve the Ramos Charitable Trust. Meredith outlined the legal issues/challenges as well as solutions. She is willing to wait until the property has been transferred to the church and the lot sold prior to receiving payment. <u>Finance Reports</u> look favorable due to the Director of Youth/Families position not currently filled.
- **Buildings / Grounds**: Next meeting 5/31, workday is 6/2.
- **Personnel**: Committee has conducted a successful interview with one candidate for Director of Youth/Families Ministries.

Next Meeting: July 19th (if needed) and August 16th.

STATEMENT BY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) STATED CLERK The Reverend Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II

June 16, 2018

As Presbyterians gather for the meeting of our 223rd General Assembly, we are mindful of the many issues of justice, peace and compassion we face, both as citizens of the United States and members of the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ.

While we face issues of peace on the Korean peninsula, tragic injustice in the Middle East, and the spectre of climate change in our nation and our world, there is nothing of more urgency than the tragedy that is unfolding at our borders, where children are ripped from their parents and placed in holding cells, while their frantic parents scream in agony at the separation.

What has this nation become? How have we wandered so far from Jesus' kind admonition, "Let the little children come to me ... for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs"? How can this be happening in a nation in which so many claim the traditions of Christianity, Judaism and Islam and the critical importance of families to the fabric of our lives together?

Perhaps the most egregious aspect of this policy is the willingness of the highest legal official of our nation to suggest that if a mother has fled violence in her own country to save herself and her children but has not had a chance to make a proper petition for safety in the U.S., she should be taught a lesson by having her children taken from her. It is almost incomprehensible that these acts should be used as a warning to others who would come.

What makes matters worse is the audacity of quoting the Apostle Paul's admonition to believers in Romans 13:1 to obey the law (presumably whatever the law says), while ignoring the higher scriptural demand that "love is the fulfilling of the law" (Romans 13:10).

The crisis of tens of thousands of desperate people coming to the United States for relief seems almost overwhelming. But as the officials of our government attempt to address the crisis, we cannot afford to tarnish the highest values of our nation. We must not punish desperate parents

by tearing their children away from them, leaving the parents without access to the children or assurance of their welfare.

In the name of God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ: Stop!
