

- By not leaving crumbs, or food or beverages lying around on the counters or on the floor. If you spill something, please take the time to clean it up.
- Please keep EVERY ITEM contained within either zip-loc bags, or the plastic storage containers in the food cupboard. This includes sugar, creamer, cookies, potato chips, snack foods – EVERYTHING EDIBLE! Item that are not 'contained' are an attractant to the evil rodents and ants with which we seem to be beleaguered)!



• Also, please do not put wet items into the container for washing – they should be taken home and laundered by those groups who use them.

As mentioned by the Deacons, we have been battling rodents for the last few weeks. We have identified and 'closed up' some places of entry, and continue to look for ways they are getting inside. We're not finished, yet.

WE DO NEED YOUR HELP! Along with the enclosed containers in cabinet, etc., we also must enclose everything. Please do not leave any open containers anymore. Inconvenient, but necessary.

- We've asked the office to order two 'step-on' garbage cans. They will be labelled as "Trash" and "Green Waste".
- Deacons will set these out and not the big open-container bins. The large ones will be used ONLY for events like potlucks and memorials when a larger can is needed. Occasionally there will be a "compost bucket" on Sunday mornings, as well, but when it's not there, please use the "green waste' can. (The large garbage cans will be stored in the back storage room to deter regular use.)
- Since plastic bags cannot go in the green waste bins outside, the contents will need to be emptied and then throw the bag in regular garbage. We will move a Green Waste bin close to the kitchen to make disposal easier.
- Reminder absolutely NO WASTE of any kind should be dumped in the manse bins. Those are reserved for the manse residents only.

• We encourage everyone to please READ SIGNS – on trash cans, doors, cabinet doors, and gates. We need everyone to pay attention to all signs. If you have any questions at all, please don't hesitate to ask someone.

Finally, I just want to say THANK YOU, to everyone who faithfully participates in our All Church Workdays. The maintenance and day-to-day tasks can't get done without your help. FPCU is blessed to have a loving, faithful, and hardworking family!

Session Meeting: July 17th

Decisions / Action Items:

- Rescheduled August meeting to Wed., August 14th
- Letter sent to Presbytery of the Redwoods regarding sale of property in the name of Ramos Family Trust
- Create Task Force to write a Key Management Policy
- Accept Julia Rodriguez' letter of resignation, with regret
- Approve increase in compensation for Children's Ministries Assistant Position from \$12.00/ hour to \$15.00/ hour.

Pastor's Report:

- Served communion to shut-ins
- 4 Study Leave days away 7/29 8/1
- 1 Military Paid Leave Day away, 8-18-19
- 4 Military Telecom Days away, 9-19-19 to 9-22-19.

Director of Youth/Families Report:

- The end of year Hangout Celebration at Todd Grove Park on 6-5-19 included 15 kids plus parents
- 8 youth helped with the rummage sale on 6-7-19, earning Community Service Hours
- Girl's Books Club began 6-10-19 and will continue throughout the summer
- VBS (6-24-19 to 6-28-19): 35-44 students each night, numerous volunteers, and 4 high school volunteers.
- Westminster Woods Summer Camp: 1) 8 youth from the congregation are going to summer camp; 2) I will be attending camp with the high school youth, 7-21-19 to 7-27-19; 3) 4 camperships were given to 4 students totaling about \$1800; 4) With funds left over in campership budget, plans are being developed to send our youth to Westminster Woods' November Bash and December Bash weekends later this year.
- A camping trip is planned for 8-4-19 to 8-5-19 at Van Damme Star Park.
- Fall Youth Plans:
 - o Junior and Senior High Youth: I am leaning toward combining together one night and then splitting them into gender groups for discussion (students seems to be able to focus better when split by gender.
 - Hangout: I was hoping to have Hangout on a weekly starting in the fall, then Julia resigned. Further discussions will be held regarding the programs. After discussion, the following motion was **MSA**: To accept Julia Rodriguez's letter of resignation, with regret.

PRESBYTERY MEETING: Travis Air Force Base on 5-17-19. The Moderator to the 223rd General Assembly, the Rev. Cindy Kohlmann preached during the worship service. Elder Ariel Mink was elected to serve as the Associate Stated Clerk for a three-year term, a volunteer position. The by-laws were changed to state that the presbytery will meet no fewer than 3 times per year as opposed to no fewer than 4 times per year. The presbytery approved all of the proposed amendments, with the exception of 18-C, Officers.

Resource Council

- **Finance:** 1) The General Fund Income for the year, noting the following June 2019 highlights: income was \$27,317 (budget \$23,502); total expenses \$19,163 (budget \$20,686); through June \$12,000 was received above expectations; 2019 shortfall to income anticipated to be \$8,793 (budgeted \$31,467). 2) The Designated Funds Income-Expenses noted income of \$14, 412 and expenses of \$10,703. Income centered on Missions Tri-Tip dinner, fundraiser garage sale, youth bake sale, as well as \$1,577 of the annual per capita budget. Expenses focused on Missions fundraiser, compassionate ministries, and per capita. 3) The Presbeat Summary as of 5-30-19 showed an income of \$106,968 and expenses of \$100,581 (-\$3,613). Additionally, total balance in checking is \$133,537, while total savings balance is \$149,884. The final section is the listing of the Designated Funds in the checking account which, on 5-30-10, totaled \$42,948.
- **Buildings and Grounds:** The next meeting is 8-1-19. The next workday is 8-3-19. The committee has been alerted to the problem of vermin in the kitchen and is addressing the issue.

Family / Outreach Council

- Worship and Music: In the coming months and in developing the 2020 budget consideration needs to be given to
 upgrading the sound and video systems (computer, programs, headsets, mics). Family Council will continue to meet
 the 3rd Tuesday of the month.
- Missions: The rummage sale earned \$3,100. The route for Pedal for Protein this year is Highway 1. 8-18-19, Patty Sanders will present a program to the congregation. Meals-to-Go fundraiser is planned to take place after the grape harvest when Len B. is more likely to be available. Shirley indicated that New Life Community Church may become the central drop off point for Operation Christmas Child for Humboldt, Mendocino, and Lake Counties instead of Santa Rosa. As such, there would not be a need for FPCU to be a drop off point. Instead, we might help man the New Life center. Plans are still in fluid.
- **Congregational Life:** The questions are being prepared for the initial interview for the Presbeat. VIP'S start again in September.



Position Description: Children's Ministry Assistant

Incumbent: OPEN **Department:** Christian Education

Effective Date: June 19, 2016 **Remuneration:** \$15.00/hour

Position Summary: To work with the Director of Youth and Family Ministries and Session through the Children's Ministry Committee in planning, developing, and supervising the Christian Education of nursery through 5th grade students at First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah.

Responsibilities:

- Schedule, oversee, and train Nursery and Sunday School volunteers
- Keep Nursery and Sunday School rooms clean and stocked with necessary supplies
- Keep detailed records of Nursery and Sunday School students and their attendance
- Coordinate activities, crafts, and curriculum for nursery through 5th graders
- Lead Sunday School on Sunday mornings (10-11:30am) and Children's Ministry every Wednesday (5-8pm)
- Study and enforce Safe Church policies to ensure child safety
- Use social media and technology to advertise and inform families about Children's Ministries activities
- Form healthy relationships with children and parent attendees of First Pres Ukiah
- Availability to help with other occasional Children's Ministry activities or events as needed

Requirements:

- Experience working with children from infants to 5th graders
- Knowledge of the Bible
- Personal commitment to the Christian faith
- The desire, joy, and enthusiasm to work with Children's Ministries
- Trained in CPR/First Aid (or willingness to become trained)
