## ***Stitches from the Heart Update***

I am so excited and thankful for the prayer shawl ministry and for the women in the group who have made and completed so many prayer shawls to be given to families. They are such a blessing to me and others. This ministry began about 3 years ago and since has blessed families with 127 shawls, (births, weddings, healing, illness and losses). We also made hats, scarves and gloves for Operation Christmas Child and items to be placed on the Christmas tree.

Our ministry has had the wonderful opportunity to reach beyond the walls of the church. We have connected with a group of women from Napa and Sonoma counties to make lap blankets and prayer shawls for our Vets. Every three months Lillian Wohlfarth, from Cloverdale, travels to the different county locations and picks up the blankets and shawls made for the Vets and delivers them to the San Francisco Vets Hospital, Ukiah and Santa Rosa Clinics and the Yontville VA Home. She has received many thanks of appreciation and gratitude for the shawls and blankets.

We have received so many cards from recipients that have said how special they have felt receiving the shawls/blankets, that words cannot explain. One recipient wrote: To the members of “Stitches From the Heart” and First Presbyterian Church, Thank you so much for all the prayers during the illness of my sweetheart. An extra big thank you for the incredibly beautiful prayer shawl. It has been such a comfort in this trying time. It is an amazing gesture of love and support...I can’t thank you enough.” This is what makes this ministry so fulfilling.

Also, someone has donated 5 large tubs of yarn. I know that we won’t be able to use all of this so I am **reaching out to the congregation**. If you are a knitter, crocheter and usually make hats or scarves for the Christmas tree, I encourage you to pick up some for your craft. Just give me a call so we can connect.

### Fourth Annual Pedal for Protein (P4P) September 17 – 23, 2017



This is a very important Redwoods Presbytery fundraising cycling event. The money raised helps food pantries along the northern coast and valleys of California to provide protein rich foods such as peanut butter, canned tuna, chicken, eggs and Greek yogurt for hungry families, seniors, homeless persons and children.

The first three P4P rides, together, raised just under \$100,000. So the impact is huge. Every dollar donated goes to Food Banks in Redwoods Presbytery and a smaller portion to the Presbyterian Hunger Program for international hunger and food justice projects.

The 2017 cycling event includes a six day loop starting at Westminster Woods in Occidental on September 17. The cyclists travel through St. Helena, Vallejo and Sonoma, and will see beautiful redwoods, fertile valleys, farmlands and vineyards.

People can also join for one or two days along the way. Or, choose 10 or 28 mile rides on bike trails or less traveled roads around Santa Rosa on Saturday, September 23.

### OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD – planning ahead – 2017!

National Collection Week is November 13 – November 20<sup>th</sup>. Collection “times” will be posted in the breezeway and on our website soon.



Once again, our church will serve as a relay center. There will be preprinted decorative shoeboxes from Operation Christmas Child available in late October. Coming Soon: Plastic shoeboxes will be available for individual purchase starting this fall. **Changes effective in 2017** – No candy of any type or toothpaste will be allowed in shoeboxes. And the suggested shipping donation has been raised to \$9.00 per shoebox.

The time is now to shop the back to school sales for paper, pencils, crayons, scissors, and other school supplies. There are lots of craft and other ideas on how to fill shoeboxes on the Pinterest website. Suggested filler items are soccer balls with pump, stuffed animals, toys (puppets, trucks, etc.) dolls (baby or Barbie type, etc.) musical instruments, t-shirts, flip flops, etc. Non-liquid hygiene items include toothbrushes, bar soap, soap containers, combs, brushes, washcloths, etc.

The receiving children especially enjoy personal notes and photos.

*The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has collected and delivered more than 146 million gift-filled shoeboxes to children in more than 150 countries. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoeboxes are the first gift they have ever received.*

## Why is the Cross draped in green?



The draping of the Cross is following the liturgical calendar. Currently the Cross is draped in green to symbolize the renewal of vegetation and generally of living things and the promise of new life. The cross will be draped in green until the beginning Advent, when it will be draped in a royal blue. Royal blue is the color of royalty to welcome the coming of a King. It can also symbolize the night sky in which the star appeared to announce the birth of Jesus. The Cross will be draped in white for Christmas Day to symbolize purity, holiness, and virtue, as well as respect and reverence. With the start of Lent, the Cross will be draped in purple that can symbolize pain, suffering, and therefore mourning and penitence. It will be draped once again in white on Easter and throughout the Easter season until Pentecost when it will be draped in red to symbolize the presence of God.

## Update on our new afternoon program "The Grateful Recovery Group"

Hi, my name is Paul Otto. I joined the Board of Nor Cal Christian Ministries approximately 3 months ago and now help facilitate, with Tony, The Grateful Recovery Group. It is a great privilege to be able to share a cup of cold water and fellowship with Jesus. (*"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in.....,The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'* Matt 25: 34-40). Nor Cal Christian Ministries, under the Directorship of Tony Huerta, opened "The Grateful Recovery Group" on May 16<sup>th</sup>. We meet Tue, Wed, and Thur from 1:00 - 4:00 PM at New Life Community Church.

The Grateful Recovery Group is built on a "Membership Model". People who participate need to be willing to do the following: 1) be clean and sober for the past 24 hrs., 2) participate weekly in a "home group", 3) be committed to a program of recovery and 4) give back in some way to the group or to others. Our goal is to live out love and respect for each person in the group as God has shown and demonstrated his love to us.

I recall the first time I was struck by the plight of the poor and God's love for them. It was a class that I was taking while attending Denver Seminary in 1972. The class was taught by a man who served in the inter-city of Denver. After taking us down to walk through parts of the "slums" he opened up the scriptures to us and gave us some insight into the heart of God as it relates to the poor. See Ps. 140:11-13, Prov. 14:31, Isaiah 58:6-8, Jer. 22:16, Matt. 25:31-46, for a small sample. I believe God has given us the poor so that we might practice the love He has shown us. In 1 John 3:17, He simply states, "If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person?"

We are excited as we work to understand and do what God has called us to do for the poor and needy. Please pray for wisdom as we try to sort out the most beneficial way in which to proceed. At times I find it hard to see in what manner God would have us go. It seems that each person who comes does so with so many issues and so much pain that it is hard to know what to address first. Of one thing I am confident, He does want us to do something! I am convinced that above all it is to first love them.

I am excited to be part of a multiple church out reach for the poor and homeless. The Board of NCCM has a goal that there will be representation on the Board from at least 10 different churches. John 13:35 Jesus tells us it is by our loving one another that others will see what it means to be his disciple.

Thank you for your participation with us in caring for those that God loves and has entrusted to us. He has called us to be His hands and feet in demonstrating his love to them. If you would like further information as to how you can be involved please call Tony at 707-481-8398.


