Patty Sanders presented a Moment for Mission on Sunday August 11. She spoke about the upcoming PEDAL-4-PROTEIN bicycle ride coming up September 21 – 28. Monies raised by this mission are used to support area food banks. Patty brought with her a number of items for sale in Bromley Hall following the service. Patty sent us an email thanking us for the warm welcome we gave her and the whopping \$851 worth of items that you purchased. FPCU will receive \$412 from these donations for our local food bank.



Mark your calendars and tell your friends, family and coworkers that we will have our famous tri-tip MEALS-TO-GO FUNDRAISER on October 25. We will be getting tickets printed up soon so we can make this the most successful fundraiser yet! The money raised from this event will be used to send our Uganda Mission Team (Shelly & Kevin Mack and David & Cathy Rodriguez) to the orphanage next January. The purpose of this visit is to determine how we can best support Pastor John's work and present him with money for the orphanage's needs from our fundraisers earmarked for this mission.

The Missions Team receives a number of requests for assistance throughout the year. We can't support them all but we do consider how we can best support God's work with our available resources. One request that is of interest to us came from HOPE CRISIS RESPONSE NETWORK. This group provides organized faith-based disaster response in Northern California. They have been active in Lake County providing assistance to folks who have suffered losses since the Valley Fire in 2015. They have provided help to 465 Lake County community cleanup and rebuilding efforts, to date. The Missions Committee is interested in partnering with a local Ukiah community home building group to support both group's efforts over the next two years. Our plans are to work with the Ukiah group this fall and then take that team to Lake County to assist them in 2020. We will be reaching out to our congregation to volunteer our time and skills to assist in supporting this new endeavor.

Shirley Lewis will be presenting a Moment for Mission on Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, to kick off OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD. This mission collects items for children that are packaged in bright boxes and sent to children in need throughout the world. The boxes will be collected on November 17 and 24 for shipment from Ukiah. Your continued support of this mission is greatly appreciated.

On December 1, Perry Crowley will be presenting a Moment for Mission to present "Birthday for Jesus". This fundraiser supports the Gideon's mission of providing bibles around the world.

Thank you for your ongoing support of our efforts doing God's work.

### **Africa is Calling (AGAIN!)**

On Monday, January 13, 2020, Kevin & Shelly Mack will be leaving for Africa. They will be traveling with Kirk & Renee Afman, Shelly's sister and brother-in-law. Renee is the Chief Operating Officer with the Alkare mission organization for Africa. Our church has been supporting Alkare through the mission committee. Their mission is to provide nutrition to orphans around the world. The first leg of the trip will be Zambia for one week. They will visit the orphanage (Kabwata) we connected with two years ago. Angela Miyanda continues to run the orphanage and provide loving care for the children. One of the significant changes since the Macks were there two years ago is the government no longer allows orphanages to provide care to children once they reach the age of 18. They are required to move out to

make room for younger children. As you can imagine, this creates an enormous challenge for these adolescents who are not ready to take on the responsibilities of adulthood in a very demanding environment. Angela does a heroic job of attempting to find job placements, housing and education for these adolescents but it is a huge task with few resources. We hope to get a clearer picture of the situation and determine how we might be able to help. Kevin also hopes to be able to visit a psychiatric hospital and meet with staff there to determine if there is a way to contribute to Zambia's budding growth in psychology. Lots of play, relationship building with the children and staff and openness to what God is doing will permeate all that happens while there.

Uganda will occupy the second half of our trip. Pastor David & Cathy Rodriguez will join them in Uganda. Our team will meet again with Pastor John Kamulegeva and Mathias Sserugo, two leaders of the Christian community in the towns of Mityana and Jinja. Pastor John would like to organize a conference of leaders that Pastor David could speak to while in Uganda. Pastors are tremendously respected in Africa (much more so than in the U.S.). Kevin will again attempt to connect with the mental health community in Uganda to determine if he can contribute in a meaningful way. We will accompany Pastor John to the American Embassy to help with his visa to visit us in the U.S. Kevin, Kirk Afman and Pastor David may lead a series of teachings/workshops on leadership development. It could be a very busy time in Uganda.



We have learned that while we may have a specific agenda when we arrive, God may have very different plans. Our goal will be to remain open, available, patient, loving and kind through all of the challenges, unanticipated changes and different ways of approaching life that brings honor to God and reflects well on our church family at First Presbyterian Ukiah. Please pray for us as we prepare, that our team remain healthy and ready for all that lies ahead. Thank you so much for all the ways you contribute to this trip. This is YOUR mission trip as much as the Mack's and Rodriguez's. You go with us in spirit and in love.



### Operation Christmas Child 2019 - Things will be a changing

First Presbyterian's congregation has been blessed by being a Drop Off Location for Ukiah and Mendocino County for almost or maybe more than 20 years. We've collected shoeboxes, had packing parties, filled cartons, transported them down to Santa Rosa all the while of praising God for allowing us to be part of this international ministry impacting so many lives with the love of Jesus. There may have been 10,000 plus boxes processed during the 20 years.

What Changes?

First Presbyterian will not be a drop off location. We will collect boxes from our congregation only. New Life Community Church ("Burger King Church") is now the central drop location for Humboldt, Lake and Mendocino Counties, meaning they will have a semi-trailer to load the cartons in (similar to Santa Rosa) to go to the Southern California processing center. They will collect boxes from all three

counties, churches and individuals. This is good news because the OCC leadership anticipate of having more than 5,000 shoeboxes collected and New Life has the facility/parking lot to accommodate this increase. Praise God!

#### **Opportunities**

New Life would appreciate First Pres and other congregations' help during their collection week November 18-25. It is always such a blessing to accept boxes from congregations, but, for me, the blessing is the children who are so excited to give these gifts to other kids internationally, spreading the good news of the Gospel.

#### **Boxes** and materials

First Pres will have Gospel Opportunity ("GO") boxes, labels, rubber bands, and other materials available for our congregation. There will be no church sponsored packing party this year.

#### Moments for Mission during the Worship Service – OCC info

October 6 – Moment for Missions presentation. A table will be set up with boxes and materials. Boxes and materials will be available every Sunday. Last day is Sunday, November 24<sup>th</sup>. And, yes, someone will be wearing the Operation Christmas Shoebox during the Moment for Missions! Be there on October 6<sup>th</sup> to see "who" that someone might be – I'm not giving out hints – yet!

November 10 – reminder to congregation during announcements to bring filled boxes to the church on 11/17 and 11/24 before 12 noon. If those dates don't work for you – you can take your box directly to New Life – dates and times to be announced.

#### Men's Bible Study – Meets every Tuesday evening @ 7am in the Kitchen



A great morning snack and coffee greets this small group of "early-bird" men for their interactive lay Bible study. They strive to confirm their faith and look for a deeper meaning through a study of the bible and/or study guides. A deep level of understanding scripture is not required.

We meet every Tuesday at 7 am in the church kitchen and utilize a free study guide. We are currently studying the Book of Acts.

All men are welcome who would enjoy great conversation and a short bible study. Come and see how the Bible can give you guidance for your life today. This is a drop-in Bible Study, come when you are able.

### Serendipity Women's Bible Study – Meets Tuesdays @ 8:30am in the Library

Using the Serendipity Bible for Groups, we study a complete book, which is mutually agreed upon by the group (currently we are studying "ACTS"), reading a specified portion each week and answering the "cup" (ice breaker), "book" (about the text) and "heart" (life application) questions. #### **Director of Youth/Families Report:**

- The end of year Hangout Celebration at Todd Grove Park on 6-5-19 included 15 kids plus parents
- 8 youth helped with the rummage sale on 6-7-19, earning Community Service Hours
- Girl's Books Club began 6-10-19 and will continue throughout the summer
- VBS (6-24-19 to 6-28-19): 35-44 students each night, numerous volunteers, and 4 high school volunteers.
- Westminster Woods Summer Camp: 1) 8 youth from the congregation are going to summer camp; 2) I will be attending camp with the high school youth, 7-21-19 to 7-27-19; 3) 4 camperships were given to 4 students totaling about \$1800; 4) With funds left over in campership budget, plans are being developed to send our youth to Westminster Woods' November Bash and December Bash weekends later this year.
- A camping trip is planned for 8-4-19 to 8-5-19 at Van Damme Star Park.
- Fall Youth Plans:
  - o Junior and Senior High Youth: I am leaning toward combining together one night and then splitting them into gender groups for discussion (students seems to be able to focus better when split by gender.
  - Hangout: I was hoping to have Hangout on a weekly starting in the fall, then Julia resigned. Further
    discussions will be held regarding the programs. After discussion, the following motion was MSA: To
    accept Julia Rodriguez's letter of resignation, with regret.

**PRESBYTERY MEETING:** Travis Air Force Base on 5-17-19. The Moderator to the 223rd General Assembly, the Rev. Cindy Kohlmann preached during the worship service. Elder Ariel Mink was elected to serve as the Associate Stated Clerk for a three-year term, a volunteer position. The by-laws were changed to state that the presbytery will meet no fewer than 3 times per year as opposed to no fewer than 4 times per year. The presbytery approved all of the proposed amendments, with the exception of 18-C, Officers.

#### **Resource Council**

- **Finance:** 1) The General Fund Income for the year, noting the following June 2019 highlights: income was \$27,317 (budget \$23,502); total expenses \$19,163 (budget \$20,686); through June \$12,000 was received above expectations; 2019 shortfall to income anticipated to be \$8,793 (budgeted \$31,467). 2) The Designated Funds Income-Expenses noted income of \$14, 412 and expenses of \$10,703. Income centered on Missions Tri-Tip dinner, fundraiser garage sale, youth bake sale, as well as \$1,577 of the annual per capita budget. Expenses focused on Missions fundraiser, compassionate ministries, and per capita. 3) The Presbeat Summary as of 5-30-19 showed an income of \$106,968 and expenses of \$100,581 (-\$3,613). Additionally, total balance in checking is \$133,537, while total savings balance is \$149,884. The final section is the listing of the Designated Funds in the checking account which, on 5-30-10, totaled \$42,948.
- **Buildings and Grounds:** The next meeting is 8-1-19. The next workday is 8-3-19. The committee has been alerted to the problem of vermin in the kitchen and is addressing the issue.

#### Family / Outreach Council

- Worship and Music: In the coming months and in developing the 2020 budget consideration needs to be given to upgrading the sound and video systems (computer, programs, headsets, mics). Family Council will continue to meet the 3rd Tuesday of the month.
- Missions: The rummage sale earned \$3,100. The route for Pedal for Protein this year is Highway 1. 8-18-19, Patty Sanders will present a program to the congregation. Meals-to-Go fundraiser is planned to take place after the grape harvest when Len B. is more likely to be available. Shirley indicated that New Life Community Church may become the central drop off point for Operation Christmas Child for Humboldt, Mendocino, and Lake Counties instead of Santa Rosa. As such, there would not be a need for FPCU to be a drop off point. Instead, we might help man the New Life center. Plans are still in fluid.
- **Congregational Life:** The questions are being prepared for the initial interview for the Presbeat. VIP'S start again in September.
